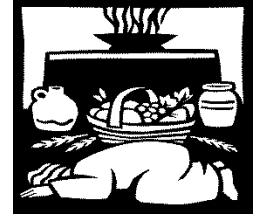

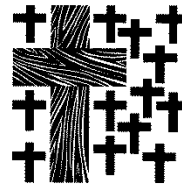

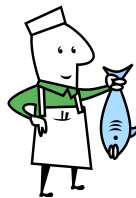

This week Mom will be moving into her new home at the Waterford in Park Falls. While this is a very nice assisted living facility, it certainly will be an adjustment for her.

Some changes in my life over the past seven years have been tough; they include the death of my brother Mike and my sister Jeanie, as well as a good friend. To witness my mom go from being so very active and independent: volunteering at her senior meal site three days a week; leading prayer in the absence of a priest; driving herself and others to appointments, church shopping and more; mowing grass by walking behind a self-propelled mower (trust me, it was a workout!); picking wild blueberries by "hopping the fence" in the summer; and list goes on – to now needing help with so many things, that's a lot of change in just a few years for her and for our family.
